(b) the contents of the identity card which are particulars furnished under regulation 4(1)(b) by the applicant for the identity card, shall lie on

(d) the person to whom the identity eard has been issued: or

any other person alleging the truth of such contents

II, in any proceedings with reference to any decision of act done or proposed to be done by a registration officer under any of these regulations, a person

(a) that he enjoys the right of abode in Hong Kong; or (b) that he is entitled to a permanent identity card,

the onus of proving the same shall lie on that person. A valid permanent identity card shall be evidence that the person to whom the card relates enjoys the right of abode in Hong Kong
